We are glad to be informed by M<sup>r</sup> Randall and your Mem<sup>o</sup> that you go on so well with the Shirts; we wish you to proceed so as to secure about 2000; if you can increase the Quantity and better the Quality by giving as far as £6 a yard, we are willing you should do so the Country Linen being so much more serviceable than the imported, we would give it the Preference, and if you see a fair Prospect of getting enough for the 2000 Shirts, we wish to have nothing to do with the imported Linen which M<sup>r</sup> Smith spoke to you and wrote to us about, but if you cannot get the Country Linen as fast as you can have it made up, we request you to get the Favor of M<sup>r</sup> Smith to supply you with enough to make up the Deficiency. If you can procure them soon, purchase as far as 1000 Hats
