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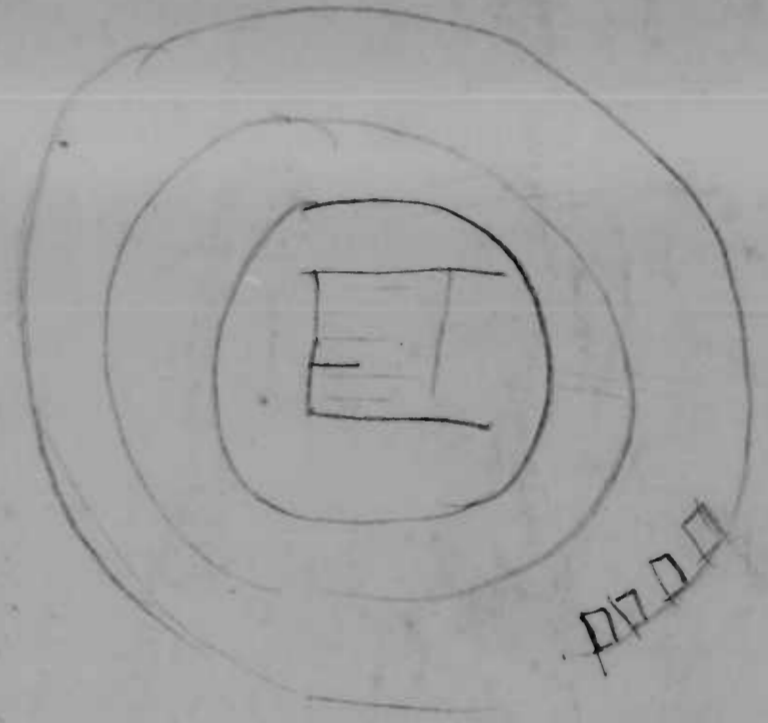

places of Meeting for the summer of
1870 a copy of their doing as reported
by Rev A. Wallace of the "Home Journal"
being found on the opposite side of
this sheet.

4th The duties of the Committee on R R + Steam Boats shall be to make arrangements for the expeditious transportation of passengers to and from the Camp and at as low rates and with as much benefit to the association as possible

5th The duties of the Committee on preparation of the ground suitable for seating and tenting, erecting the stand and seats and tents, and renting the ground for private tents

6th The duties of the Committee on Lumber and erection of Buildings shall be to procure lumber and deliver it on the ground, to erect Store Room and committee rooms and all necessary out buildings

7th The duties of the Committee on Water and Light shall be to make provision for an ample supply of Water for the use of the camp and for sufficient lighting of the ground

8th The duties of the Committee on "Tents" is to procure all tents and rent the same and at the close of the Camp to return them to their respective owners,

9th The duties of the Committee on privileges shall be to rent all privileges incident to Camp Meetings such as Boarding tents, Horse pond, Barbers tent Book Store &c &c.

10th The duties of the Committee on Store shall be the purchasing of supplies for the store for the supply of Ice Milk, Bread, Meat, or whatever may be required at the store or any of its departments

11th The duties of the Committee on Roads shall be to ^{maintain} keep the road & avenue in good repair and to have charge of the gate or gates.

12th The duties of the Committee on Furniture & Bedding shall be to procure all furniture, bedding straw &c and rent the same and at the close of the Camp to return it to their owners

13th The duties of the Committee on printing shall be to contract for all printing necessary to be done.

14th The duties of the Committee on accounts shall be the inspection of all bills the supervision of the daily accounts that may be rendered and perform such other duties as may be required of him

15th The duties of Committee on police shall be to provide an efficient police force and make such provision for their distribution with the chief Manager as to secure the peace of the encampment

16th The duties of Committee on Baggage delivery shall be to provide transportation for the prompt delivery of Baggage to and from the Camp.

17th Resolved that Rev M J Smyser have charge of Nos 4th, 8th, 12th & 13th

Resolved that John Wright have charge of Nos 5, 9, 11, 15 & 6

Resolved that S J Seneca have charge of Nos 7, 10, 14, & 16

Harrods Grace July 7th 1870

At meeting held this day present Rev D. L. Smyser J. Wright & S. Seneca, the following regulations for the privilege of keeping restaurants & Boarding tents were unanimously adopted

For restaurant privilege one hundred dollars in cash. To board any persons that the committee may designate free, and such Ministers or persons in the employ of the committee as may present themselves with a card from the Committee at the following rates for Breakfast & Tea 30[¢] single meal for dinner 50[¢] for single meal and ^{per day} 75[¢] for three days and upwards. For Boarding tents same as above except \$50 instead of \$100 in cash

For Barber tent privilege seventy five (75) for exclusive privilege no work to be done on Sunday or if two \$40 each, they charging the following prices for cutting hair 25[¢] for shaving 15[¢] Blacking boots 10[¢]

For Horse feeding privilege \$25

For furnishing meat to the encampment 12cts per lb

For furnishing vegetables 10 per cent on amount of sales



Minutes of the proceedings of the Building Committee of the M.E. Church at New de Grace.

The Building Committee appointed by a meeting of the Deacons, Stewards and Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church, held on Monday night Oct 10th 1870. met at and composed of Rev. M. L. Smyser, W. J. Willhiser, Henry Loran, C. P. Fields, Henry Baker, and Peter Kelschman.

The Committee met in the Church on this evening Oct 11th and were called to order by Rev. M. L. Smyser, officio Chairman. On motion of Bro Baker, Vol. Thompson's Price was added to the Committee. Bro Kelschman was elected Secy. and led J. T. Fring was elected Treasurer to the Committee. On motion, Rev. M. L. Smyser and Henry Baker were appointed the Committee on Immigration.

Committee on Wall - Henry Curver & C. P. Fields. Committee on Bricks

Committee on Lumber - W. J. Willhiser and C. P. Fields. General Superintendent of building C. P. Fields.

On motion of Henry Curver, it was decided to put 4 windows in each side room and 2 in rear of Infant School room.

On motion the Pastor Rev. M. L. Smyser be requested to see Matthew Stoulet in reference to work on building.

On motion, adjourned to meet Friday night October 21st 1870.

On Motion Rev. M. L. Smyser be requested to employ the services of Fredrick (of Baltimore) to put up brick wall

Committee on Lumber. Report Lumber ready to be hauled up.

On motion the resolution adopted at a previous meeting in reference to locating windows was reconsidered - and on motion of H. Baker it agreed to put three windows in the rear of Church of equal size, and one on each side of each room.

On Motion of J. Thompson Freize - Resolved That the President be Authorized to contract with Wm. H. Evans, for plastering - cost not to exceed 12 cents per sq. yard. Two coats & - - - - - Adopted

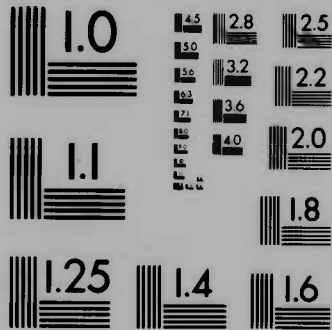
