The Honble Sam¹ Young Charles Greenberry John Hall and W<sup>m</sup> Whittington Esq¹s were directed to go and pursuant to a Dedimus Potestatem for that purpose to administer the Oaths appointed by Law to the respective Delegates Who went in & some small time after returned and said They had administred the oaths required by Law to the Delegates and Burghesses Whom they saw Subscribe the Test

The Honble Presid<sup>t</sup> acquainted the members of her Majesty's Council with what he intended to say to the House of Delegates upon their meeting which was well approved of by the Board
