Read the second time the Bill entituled an Act for the more effectual Punishment of Negroes and other Slaves and for taking away the Benefit of Clergy from certain Offenders, and to an Act entituled an Act to prevent the tumultuous Meetings and other Irregularities of Negroes and other slaves and directing the manner of Trying of Slaves; and read the second time the Bill entituled an Act to enable the Rector Vestrymen and Church Wardens of Saint James's Parish in Anne Arundel County to lease Lands belonging to Saint James's Church in manner and to the Uses therein mentioned, passed and sent by Samuel Chamberlain Esq<sup>r</sup>

An Engrossed Bill from the Lower House by Mess<sup>rs</sup> King and Gale Entituled an Act to enable Samuel Wilson Executor of Margarett Lindow to convey certain Lands to David Wilson thus subscribed
