Monday Morning June 30th 1746

The House met According to Adjournment, and the proceeding of Saturday were read: all members being present as on Saturday, except M^r John Gresham, M^r Richard Gresham, and Col. Hall

M^r Pemberton, a member returned for Queen Ann's County appears in the House

M^r Hopper and M^r Tilghman are sent with M^r Pemberton to the Upper House to see him Qualified: They return and acquaint M^r Speaker they saw him qualified in the usual manner.

p. 599 The Gentleman takes his seat in the House

The Bill entituled, An Act for raising Four Pence Sterling per Hogshead on all Tobacco to be exported for purchasing Arms and Ammunition; and for an immediate Supply of Arms, for the Defence of this province, was sent to the Upper House by M^r Lloyd and Doctor Buchanan

The Bill entituled An Act for the easier and better securing the Estates of Debtors absconding, and of Persons Bankrupt for the use of their Creditors, and equal Distribution of the same, was read the second Time, passed, and sent to the Upper House by M^r Joseph Hall and Col. Scarborough

M^r Wilkinson appears in the House. Ordered, That the Journal of Acco^{ts} be closed to Wednesday next: And Resolved, that this House will not Proceed to any new Business after that Day.

The House met according to adjournment. The House having Considered the Report from the Committee appointed to inspect the office and Proceedings of the Commiss^{rs} of the Paper Currency office,

Resolved, That it is the Duty of the Trustees in London to transmit, to the Commiss^{rs} or Trustees for emitting Bills of Credit established by Act of Assembly, Yearly with their Accounts, proper and
