[2] You as Cłk or Reg<sup>r</sup> of this Hon<sup>rble</sup> Court Shall make just and true entry of all Such Judgements orders decrees Rules process or proceedings that Shall be adjudged Ordered decreed Ruled or proceeded in by and before their Majesties Most Hon<sup>rble</sup> Judges of the Same Court and a Just true fair Record you Shall duely and truly make or cause to be made thereof you Shall doe noe falsehood nor consent to any to be done in the Court and if you know of any you Shall Informe his Ex<sup>ney</sup> the Govern<sup>r</sup> or other Judge of the Same Court that it may be reformed you Shall delay no Man that has to do with You in Yo<sup>r</sup> Said Office Either for Envy hatred or hopes of gain you Shall increase noe Fees but be Content with the fees Limitted or to be Limitted by Law or the Order of the Court and finally you Shall well and faithfully Execute the Office of Clerke or Register of this Hon<sup>rble</sup> Court
