for himselfe & his sonne William the just quantity of eleven hundred pounds  
of tobacco in Cash to be payd 9<sup>o</sup> 10<sup>o</sup> day of October in the year 1673 which  
quantity the said William did affirm to make payment yett the  
summe of 1100<sup>o</sup> lbs. though often demanded & requested to make payment  
hath not done but the same altogether doth deny to the great Damadge of  
the said Thomas & further saith that he hath lost by value of 2200<sup>o</sup> lbs. in Cash  
& thereupon Justly brings his Suit
