

1 DELEGATE CHABOT: Mr. President, I believe that
2 we ought not to burden ourselves with unnecessary goals
3 and unnecessary time limits. We are all adults. We
4 recognize our obligations.

5 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Chabot, I wonder if you
6 are directing yourself to the amendment to Rule 28. That
7 does not deal with time limits.

8 DELEGATE CHABOT: I am sorry. I thought we
9 were at 28(a).

10 THE PRESIDENT: No.

11 DELEGATE SCANLAN: This is the written report.

12 THE PRESIDENT: Any discussion of the amendment
13 to Rule 28? Are you ready for the question? The question
14 arises on the adoption of the Committee's addition to
15 Rule 28. All in favor, signify by saying Aye; contrary,
16 No. The amendment is adopted. Delegate Scanlan?

17 DELEGATE SCANLAN: I now move the Committee's
18 recommendation that a new Rule 28 be added to the rules
19 under which the substantive reports, reports of substan-
20 tive committees must reach the Committee of the Whole by
21 November 17, 1967.
