A bill to incorporate the Maidens Choice Passenger Railway company with power to construct a gravel road for general travel on the bed of said road;

A bill to incorporate the Dorchester and Delaware Railroad company, and to direct the payment to the said company of the sum of money pledged by the Act passed at January session 1860, chapter 303, to works of internal improvement in Dorchester county;

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.
