In case of appeals from judgments of justices of the peace, the judges of the county to decide according to the right of the case and the law of the land without regarding any defect in the proceedings before such justice—1823, ch. 172, 797

JUDGMENT.

No judgment, (except to the state,) shall be good and pleadable after the principal debtor and creditor have been both dead twelve years, or the debt above twelve years standing—1715, ch. 23, sec. 6, 11

Judgment to be given according as the very right of the cause and matter in law shall appear to the court, without regarding any omissions, errors, &c. so as sufficient matter shall appear in the proceedings upon which the court may give judgment, and that the action was commenced after the cause had accrued—1763, ch. 23, sec. 2, 106

Judgment shall not be reversed, or execution delayed, by reason of any such imperfection—1763, ch. 23, sec. 2, 106

Not to extend to cases of treason, felony, murder, or prosecutions on penal statutes—1763, ch. 23, sec. 3, 106

Directions for assigning judgments to sureties, and manner of issuing executions thereon—1763, ch. 23, sec. 8, 107

Judgments not to be arrested or reversed by reason of a juror who tried the cause, having a matter of fact for trial at the court—Oct. 1778, ch. 21, sec. 2, 141

When to issue on other judgments—Oct. 1778, ch. 21, sec. 7, 142
