CHAPTER 96.

AN ACT to Incorporate the Monrovia and Libertytown Turnpike Road Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a Company be incorporated to make a Turnpike Road, beginning at or near William Downey's Mills, near Monrovia, and running through New Market and New London to Libertytown, and connecting with the Liberty and Pipe Creek Turnpike Road in said town.

Detrick and Henry Baker, for a capital stock of thirty thousand dollars, in shares of twenty dollars each, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose aforesaid, who after at least ten days' notice by publication, in two newspapers of Frederick County, of the time and place of opening said subscription books, at which time and at each place at least three of the above named Commissioners shall attend, and shall permit all persons and corporations who
