Mr. Browne, from the Select Committee, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to empower the Mayor and Common Council of Manchester, to subscribe to the capital stock of the Parkton and Manchester Railroad Company, reported it without amendment.

Said bill was then read the second time.

Mr. Stephenson, from the Select Committee, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act authorizing John H. Stokes, of Harford county, surviving Trustee, to sell and convey a parcel of land to the Trustees of Deer Creek Monthly Meeting of Friends, for the use of their members at Broad Creek Meeting, reported it without amendment.

Said bill was then read the second time,

Mr. Jump, from the Select Committee, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to provide for the per diem. and mileage of Jurors in Talbot and Caroline counties, reported it unfavorably,

And the report was adopted.

Mr. Miller, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 18, of Article 73, of the Public General Laws, entitled "Penitentiary," and to re-enact the same with amendments, reported it without amendment.

Said bill was then read the second time.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to empower all persons owners of water privileges or owners of lands along the waters of the Antietam creek, in Washington county, &c.,

Was read the third time and rejected for want of a constitutional majority, by yeas and nays, as follows :
