Mr. Wilson submitted the following amendments:

Chapter V., section 3, line 3, strike out "district" and insert county.

Chapter VI., section 1, strike out all after the word "duty," in the first line, to the word "the," in the second line.

Chapter VI., section 3, line 2, strike out "district" and insert county.

Chapter XVIII., section 1. It shall be the duty of the Board of County School Commissioners, when any election district or any contiguous election districts, shall present a building for a high school in said district or districts, to the Board of County School Commissioners, to accept the same, (if in the judgment of the Board there is any necessity therefor,)
