A bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Hall's Spring Railroad Company.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 6 of an Act passed at the January session 1867, chap. 298, sub-title an Act to incorporate the Pennsylvania Line Railroad Company, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

A bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower the County Commissioners of Talbot, Caroline and Wicomico counties to control and regulate the public roads and bridges in said counties.

A bill entitled an Act supplementary to an Act passed at the December session 1824, entitled an Act to confirm an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled an Act incorporating the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 329, of 1868, entitled public roads in Talbot and Caroline counties.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Senators from Talbot, Caroline and Somerset counties.

A bill entitled an Act to incorporate the People's Land, Loan and Deposit Company of Maryland.
