The tellers on the part of the House, Messrs. Gorman, Cameron and Streett, having in charge the box containing the ballot cast by the House on yesterday, then proceeded to the Senate Chamber.

Mr. Hoblitzell moved that the House take a recess for twenty minutes.

Decided in the negative.

Mr. Hardcastle, of Talbot (the rules being suspended) submitted the following order :

Ordered, That the Boards of County Commissioners of the several counties of the State be, and they are hereby, requested to communicate to this House, as soon as practicable, copies of all accounts rendered by the Sheriff, Clerk of the Circuit Court, Register of Wills, and State's Attorney, for fees or other charges against their respective counties ; also, all accounts for local printing for and during the year 1869 ;
