Mr. Spates, from a Select Committee, to which leave had been granted, reported a bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 170, 171, and 172 of Article I. of the Code of Public Local Laws, under the head of "Allegany County," relating to weights and measures, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Mr. Williams, from a Select Committee, to which leave had been granted, reported a bill, entitled an Act to provide for the repair and improvement of the public roads in Calvert county.

Mr. Tuck, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which leave had been granted, reported a bill, entitled an Act to give certain deeds wherein the amount of unpaid purchase money may express the effect of mortgage deeds and preserve the vendor's lien thereon in Allegany county.

Mr. Earle, from the Committee on Finance, reported unfavorably on the Memorial of the Faculty of Dental Surgery, asking aid from the State.
