I have the honor herewith to acknowledge the communication of your Honorable Body, requesting information as to the rents of any one or part of one of the State Tobacco Warehouses, and "disposition of the money" received by me.

The report of the Department of Labor and Agriculture for the years 1868, '9, reply to the only section rented in Warehouse No. 2, the Inspector of Tobacco having received, and retained said receipts to the State, as per their respective reports, now filed with the Comptroller.

The report of the Department for the years of 1870, '71, will account for the rents of those years and their application. This report will be submitted soon as printed, or can be had, if desired by your Honorable Body, in manuscript.
