Leave was granted to Messrs. Wilmer, Hurtt and Penington to report a bill entitled an Act to repeal section 7 of the Act passed March 8, 1856, chapter 148, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kent County Railroad Company," and to re-enact the same as follows.
