

disburse the said sums of money herein appropriated for the objects and purposes specified, to or upon the order of the person or persons, body politic or corporate, severally entitled to receive the same.

In force. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT to add a new article to the Code of Public General Laws, regulating the Inspection of Tobacco.

Inspection of tobacco. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following article regulating the Inspection of Tobacco, be added to the Code of Public General Laws:

Appointm't of Inspectors. SECTION 1. That the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall biennially appoint five Inspectors of Tobacco, one for each tobacco warehouse in the City of Baltimore, and also one Supervisor of said warehouses.

To give bond SEC. 2. That the said Inspectors so appointed shall, before entering upon the discharge of their duties as Inspectors of Tobacco, be required to give bond in the sum of thirty thousand dollars each, satisfactory to the Treasurer of the State, for punctual and full returns at the end of each quarter, and for the faithful performance of all the duties imposed upon them by law; and the said bonds shall be recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city.

To take charge of effects. SEC. 3. That any Inspector of Tobacco who is now, or may hereafter be appointed by the Governor, to any of the warehouses in the City of Baltimore, who shall have properly bonded, and duly qualified according to law, shall take charge of all the tobacco-books, furniture, appurtenances and effects, found in
