BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for Baltimore county court, or any one of the judges thereof during the recess of the said court, to extend to the said William C. Beard the benefit and relief of the act of assembly passed at November session eighteen hundred and five\*, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the supplements thereto, without compelling him to produce the assent of two-thirds in amount of his creditors, and to extend and afford to the said William C. Beard, all the benefits, advantages and provisions, of the aforesaid act, and the supplements thereto, in the same manner, and upon the same terms and conditions, as if he had obtained the assent of two-thirds of his creditors to his release under the same.

CHAP. CCXXV.

Passed Jan. 7, 1812 An Act for the relief of Alexander Turner, of the City of Baltimore. Lib. TH. No. 3, fol. 323.

Benefit of insolvent laws extended to him.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges, or any judge of Baltimore county court, be and they, or any of them, are hereby authorised and directed to extend to Alexander Turner, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the act of assembly passed at November session eighteen hundred and fivet, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the several supplements thereto, without requiring the said Alexander Turner to produce the assent, in writing, of two-thirds of his creditors, as is prescribed by the provisions of the said act and supplements.
