2. AND BE IT ENACTED. That the trustees of the poor for Abalance to be Charles county be and they are hereby authorised and required to paid to her pay to the above named Mary Johnson any and whatever balance may be due from the said trustees to a certain Catherine Johnson who is now dead, without requiring any administration on said deceased's estate.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Acts continued all such acts, and parts of such acts of assembly, as would expire with the present session of assembly, be and the same are hereby continued until the twentieth day of November next, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

the levy court of Prince-George's county be and are hereby authorised, so long as they shall see cause, to levy on the assessable property of said county, a sum of money not exceeding one hundred dollars, to be applied under the direction of said court, towards the support and maintenance of the children of the late Thomas Littleford, or of such of them as the said court may consider proper objects to be supported out of the poor-house of said county.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Lotery authorised Samuel Sterett, Robert Gilmor, junior, Nicholas Brice, Robert Goodloe Harper, John Hoffman, Doctor Ashton Alexander, Richard Caton, Jonathan Meredith, and Doctor John B. Davidge, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorised to raise by way of a lottery or lotteries a sum of money not exceeding thirty thousand dollars, over and above all expenses and commissions allowed on sales of tickets and in drawing said lottery or lotteries, for the purpose of purchasing a convenient lot, and erecting there-
