

CHAP. 14. to intersect the great road between Dysart's tavern and the stone school house, called Union School.

Plot and certificate to be made and returned. **2. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That it shall be the duty of the commissioners aforesaid, on or before the first day of September next, to cause a plot and certificate of said road to be made, and return the same to the levy court of Cecil county at their first sitting thereafter, whereupon it shall and may be lawful for the levy court of said county to levy upon the assessable property of the said county, a sum of money, such as they may deem necessary, and to appoint an overseer to open and clear said road agreeably to the plot and certificate aforesaid; and the said road, when opened and cleared as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby declared to be for ever thereafter a public road, and shall be kept in repair as other public roads in said county.

Damages to be ascertained. **3. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall value and ascertain the damages that may be sustained by each and every of the persons through whose lands the said road may pass by opening the same, taking into estimation the advantages and disadvantages if any; and the damages so ascertained shall be levied and assessed as other county charges are, and shall be paid over to the persons respectively through whose lands the said road may pass, petitioners for said road excepted; *Provided nevertheless*, that no money shall be levied or assessed for the purpose of discharging the damages that may be done, to any person or persons petitioning this general assembly for said road.

Commissioners compensation. **4. AND BE IT ENACTED,** That the said commissioners shall be entitled to receive a compensation for their attendance and services in discharge of their duties under this act, not exceeding two dollars per day, to be ascertained by the levy court, which is hereby directed to be levied, collected and paid, as other county charges are levied, collected and paid.
