there shall be a deduction of one eighth part thereof, and if reduced to one per cent. there shall be a deduction of one fourth part thereof; and on exports in any fuch vessel, navigated and owned as aforesaid, there shall be a deduction of one third part of the duty imposed by this act; and on imports in any weller built within this state, and entirely owned by citizens thereof, and wholly navigated by a mafter and mariners, all of whom are citizens of this state, there shall be a deduction from the duties imposed by this act on enumerated articles, of one third part thereof, and from the two per cent. duty, a deduction of one fourth part thereof, and if reduced to one per cent. a deduction of one half part thereof; and on exports in any fuch veffel, there shall be a deduction of one half part of the duty imposed by this act; and it shall be fully proved, by oath or affirmation of the person requiring the deduction allowed by this act, or by other credible testimony, to the entire satisfaction of the naval officer, that such vessel was built within this state, and is navigated and owned as required by this act, or he shall not make any deduction, and if any doubt arises, he may refer the party, with the proof, to the governor and the council, whose decision shall be conclusive.

What marideemed citizens, &c.

XVII. and, to ascertain what mariners or seamen shall be deemed citizens of this state within the meaning of this act, Be it enacted. That any mariner or feaman, above fourteen and under fifty years of age, may repair to any naval officer, and there deliver in his name, age, stature, complexion, (natural marks if any) and place of birth, and require the naval officer to register him accordingly, and to give him a certificate thereof under his hand and feal of office, and such certificate shall be sufficient evidence that such mariner is a citizen of this state; and every registered seaman and mariner shall be exempted from all military and militia service, (except only in case of a real invasion of the state) and shall have a preference of being admitted into any hospital that may hereafter be crected in this state; and every registered seaman or mariner may, if he pleases. wear some honorary mark of distinction; provided, that this privilege shall not infringe any stipulation in any treaty made with any kingdom or state by the United States in congress affembled; and every naval officer shall enter in a book to be kept for that purpose only, the names of such persons alphabetically, with their age, stature, complexion, (natural marks if any) and place of birth, and the time when registered, and annually, in the month of October, transmit a fair copy thereof to the clerk of the house of delegates, to be by him entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.

XVIII. And he it enacted, That after the five per cent. granted to congress cent. duty is shall take place, only one per cent. shall be collected by the naval officers on to take place, the non-enumerated articles in virtue of this act.

XIX. And he it enacted, That this act shall be esteemed in all courts of law A public act, &c. and equity to be a public act, and notice thereof shall be taken as such by all courts and persons accordingly.

Continuance.

XX. This act to continue seven years, and to the end of the next session of the general affembly thereafter.

C H A P. LXXXV.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to impose duties on certain enumerated articles imported into and exported out of this state, and all other goods, wares and merchandises, imported into this state.

How duties are to be applied, &c.

If it enacted, by the general assembly of Maryland, That three fourths of the money collected and received for duties in virtue of the faid act, shall be remitted to the continental treasury, and the residue shall be subject to the future disposition of the general assembly; and the duties on exports, imposed by the said act, shall be continued for and during the term of three years, and no longer.
