1852—

On the first Wednesday in December being the first day after said month in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty two the day appointed by the Constitution and laws of the United States on which the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America are directed to assemble and perform the trust reposed in them there appeared in the Senate Chamber in the City of Annapolis (the place designated by act of Assembly for the meeting of said Electors) the following gentlemen who had been proclaimed by the Executive Authority of this State to have been duly elected Electors of President and Vice President of the United States in and for the State of Maryland to wit:

Cathell Humphreys of Somerset County,	
Robert W. Lane of Baltimore City	
John Parrott of Calvert County	
Richard H. Allix of Washington County	
Carroll Spence of Baltimore City	
Charles M. Gwynn of Baltimore City	
Joseph A. Wickes of Kent County	
Ephraim R. Wilson of Worcester County	

The said Electors severally qualified by taking the oath prescribed by the Constitution to be taken by all civil officers and by declaring their belief in the Christian religion.

On motion of Mr. W. Lane Cathell Humphreys was unanimously chosen President.

On motion of Mr. W. Lane Jonathan Pinkney was unanimously appointed Secretary who duly qualified, such.

On motion of Mr. McLane William Blodrook was appointed messenger and James Hopkins doorkeeper who severally qualified.

On motion of Mr. W. Lane the Electors proceeded to ballot for President of the United States.

Mr. W. Lane nominated Franklin Pierce of the State of New Hampshire. The ballots of the Electors were deposited in the ballot box which was sealed and signed.
