Proceedings of Electors

President and Vice President of the United States, in and for the State of Maryland.

On the second Monday of January, being the fourteenth day of said month, in the year eighteen hundred and one, the day appointed by the Constitution and Laws of the United States on which the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, are directed to assemble and perform the trust reposed in them, then appeared, at the hour of noon, in the Senate Chamber, in the State House, in the City of Annapolis, Maryland (the time and place designated by Acts of Assembly for the meeting of said Electors) the following gentlemen who had been proclaimed by the Executive authority of the State to have been duly elected, Electors of President and Vice President of the United States, in and for the State of Maryland, to wit:

The said Electors severally qualified by taking the oath prescribed by the Constitution to be taken by all civil officers.
