On the First Wednesday, in December, the Fifth day of the said Month, in the year One Thousand eight Hundred and Thirty two being the day appointed by the Constitution and Laws of the United States of America, on which the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States are directed to assemble and perform the trust imposed in them, there appeared in the Lower Chamber, in the City of Annapolis being the place provided by Law for the meeting of the said Electors, the following Gentlemen, who had been proclaimed by the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland, as duly elected Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, in another the said State of Maryland, to wit:

For the First District.

William B. Tyler, and

William Price, Logarius,

Levi T. Heath and

William Flick, Logarius,

John Spear Smith Logarius,

John N. Steele, Robert H. Goldsborough,

Wright and Albert Constable Logarius.

Joseph Kent and friends of Causes Logarius, who had also been so claimed, by the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland, as duly elected from the First District, Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, in and for the said State of Maryland were prevented from attending by ill health, and did not appear.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the Electors proceeded to organize, where,

The Honorable Robert H. Goldsborough was chosen President, and for Vice President, Secretary.

Mr. Andrew Lewis was appointed Messenger, and Mr. Samuel Price Door Keeper.

The Electors then proceeded to ballot for President and Vice President of the United States of America in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and Laws of the United States of America.
