CHAPTER 632.

AN ACT directing the Police Commissioners of Baltimore City to pay to Joseph J. Gilbert, a former captain of the Baltimore City police force, a pension of fifteen dollars per week.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Police Commissioners of Baltimore City, after a careful examination, are satisfied it is proper, are hereby authorized and empowered to pay to Joseph J. Gilbert, a former captain of the police force of Baltimore City, out of the funds in their possession or subject to their control, a weekly pension of fifteen dollars, payable on the last day of each week.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 633.

AN ACT to add two new sections to Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Wicomico County," sub-title "Fish," to be designated as Sections 50A and 50B, to follow Section 50 of said Article.

Wicomico

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That two new sections be and the same are hereby added to Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Wicomico County," sub-title "Fish," to be designated as Sections 50A and 50B to follow Section 50 of the said Article, and to read as follows:

etc., in cer-
tain creeks.

50A. No person shall take or catch fish with or use or employ in taking and catching of fish, within five hundred yards on the lower side and one hundred yards on the upper side of the mouth of Quantico creek, Ruvastico creek or Barren creek, any pound net or fike net or any other net, trap or device.
