532 ARTICLE 2.

any contract be signed by either the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County or the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, the written approval of said Public Service Commission shall first be obtained; and provided further that said Public Service Commission shall have at all times jurisdiction over said contract.\*
