CHAPTER 338.

Passed March An act for recording the courses and distances of the public 9, 1844. roads in Harford county.

Clerk to record courses

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, and distances. That it shall be the duty of the clerk of the commissioners of Harford county, to record in a well bound book the courses and distances, and bounds and descriptions of any new public road hereafter opened by said commissioners, and also the courses and distances, bounds and description of every alteration in the location of an old public road, and the book in which the same is recorded shall be furnished by the said commissioners at the expense of the county, and such an alphabet shall be made to said records as will facilitate the finding of the courses of any particular road.

CHAPTER 339.

Passed March 9, 1844.

An act to amend the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, prohibiting any money being drawn from the Treasury of the State, but in consequence of appropriations made by law.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That no money shall be drawn from the Treasury of this State, but in consequence of appropriations made by law.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be conmed to be part firmed by the General Assembly, at its first session after of constituti- the next election of delegates to the General Assembly, then this act and the amendment to the Constitution therein contained, shall constitute and be valid as a part of said Constitution and Form of Government to all intents and purposes, and every thing therein contained, repugnant to this act be repealed and abolished.
