holders, residents of the ward or districts wherein said license would be operative; and whenever any license shall be issued to a feme covert or minor, the said feme covert or person under the age of twenty-one years shall be responsible for all contracts made in the prosecution of such business under such license, and shall be liable to be sued therefor in any of the courts of this State, and the said feme covert may be sued or indicted and prosecuted in case of a violation by her of the license law of this State, or in case she should keep a disorderly house, as if she were a feme sole, and if judgment be obtained against her on any contract, execution shall or may issue in the ordinary way to effect her separate estate; provided, however, that such responsibility shall in no manner effect or impair the responsibility of the husband of such woman or parent of such infant under existing laws.

SEC. 56. If the applicant for a license lives out of the county or city wherein he proposes to carry on such business of selling, bartering or otherwise disposing of or offering for sale such goods, chattels, wares and merchandise, or if the applicant lives out of the State, or is unable to apply in person by reason of sickness or bodily infirmity, his or her agent may apply for license and make the affidavit as hereinbefore provided.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That the rights of the State in all suits or prosecutions, civil or criminal, now pending in any of the courts of this State under said sections, are hereby saved and reserved, and that the same shall be prosecuted to a final determination and judgment, and the payment of all fines and penalties recovered under said judgments shall be enforced in the same manner as if the said sections had not been repealed and re-enacted.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage.
