 aboard of our ship the forsd Lett. Hunter offered to goe along with him and our Docton replied, that it was a
 dishonourable thing to offer to leave the ship so they fell a quarrelling & I went upon deck & presented the
 forsd Lett. Hunter & the Docton was fighting whereupon I went down & told Lett. Hunter in my armed aff
 the Docton with me adoe so Lett. Hunter fell upon me & I sayd to him good Lett be still & make no more of it
 otherwise if you will not be quaitt I will murther no more with you then I would to do it & did own him no more
 till it all that I did concerning the forsd aridout to his aft of my knowledge: untill I saw him lay ing dead I
 knew no malice or enmy that either in Cuthberts or Lett. Hunter had to one another among the boate

The abovesd Deposition was read in Court, to the truth of whereof the Dependent. John: Orr. made Oath too.

8. John: Dartlay Boy aboard the forsd ship did see Lett. Hunter & our Docton strugle in the Cabin there
 after Lett. Hunter went to the Deck being in drink, then a while there after in Cuthberts being in drink
 too. on to the Deck, with sword and baguet in his hands, then Lett. Hunter, seeing his armed went to the Pool
 & got a halibut so in Cuthberts stood still & spoke not a word to any man, then Lett. Hunter came to him
 and sayd man doe thou know that I am afraid of my life & whether or nott he struck or pushed att with
 his halibut at in Cuthberts & I am not tell but in Cuthberts fell backward att y Storey door & I fled
 out of the way & did no more till I saw he was dead. John: Dart.

The abovesd Deposition was read in Court, to the truth of whereof the Dependent made Oath too.

The aforesd Justices having inspected into the premises doo find cause of Commitment. And therefore doo
 Order the Sheriffe of our County to take into his Custody the forsd Andrew: Cuthberts and him in
 said Custody keep so that he have his body before the Justices at the next Probintial Court to be holden
 at the City of St. Maries then & there to answer to what shall be objected agt him thesd Cuthberts & Malice
 Concerning the death of Robert: Hunter.

The Court likewise Ordered that John: Douthin, Male to the said Cuthberts, should give Bond for him
 self & the rest of the ships Company to appear at the forsd Probintial Court to give in their Evidence on
 behalf of their Malice agt thesd Andrew: Cuthberts.

And the said John: Douthin did this day being the 18th day of April Anno Domini 1692. in Court by way
 of Recognizance acknowledge and confess him self to be justly indebted to their Malice King William &
 Queen Mary the just sum of One hundred pounds Sterling money of England, due to be paid on his goods
 & Chattels for their Malice upb Fra.

The Condition of whereof Recognizance is such that if the abovesd John: Douthin, Alexander: Davidson, John
 Reid, John: Brown, John: Williland, John: Gatorson, John: Orr & John: Dart. doo make their personal appearance
 at the next Probintial Court to be holden at the City of St. Maries to give in their Evidence for their Malice agt
 thesd Andrew: Cuthberts & Malice.
