

In the Name of God Amen. This Certificate of September in the year of our Lord God one thousand
 six hundred and ninety. William Brodren of the County and Province of Northampton being
 in body. Out of good and perfect memory, thinketh to be altogetherly yet, and willing to remembrance
 his undertain Estate of this transitory life, and that all flesh must give to death, with it shall
 please God to call, do make, constitute, Ordain and declare, this my last will and Testament in manner
 and forme following, Revoking and annulling by these presents all and every Testament and will
 heretofore by me made, and declared, either by word or writing, and this to be taken only for my
 last will and Testament and none other, And first being penitent and sorry for my sins past humbly
 desiring forgiveness for the same, I give and commit my soule unto Almighty God my Governor & Redeemer
 in whom and by his merits of Jesus Christ I trust and beseech assuredly to be saved, and to have full
 remission and forgiveness of all my sins, and that my soule with my body at the general day of resurrection
 shall rise again with joy expecting my body to be buried in such place where it shall please my Executor
 hereafter named to appoint, and for the settling of my ^{temporal} Estate, and my goods Chattle and Cattle as it
 shall please God to bestow upon me. God Order and give the same in manner and forme following
 that is to say. First I will that all those debts and duties as I owe in right or conscience to any
 person what soever shall be truly counted and paid, with in a convenient time after my decease
 by my Executor hereafter named. Item my Will is that my loving Wife Sarah Brodren do
 peaceably & quietly have hold and enjoy the plantation whereon I now live called Brodrens
 thence, for and during her naturall life, together with all householts, & doings of butchers &
 with all conveniences thereto belonging. And after my said Wife's decease, then I give &
 bequeath the said Land to my son William Brodren and to the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten
 for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son John Brodren a tract of Land called
 milke and containing two hundred and fifty acres to have and to hold the same to him my said son
 John and to the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever, and to be at age at the years of
 eighteen. Item I give and bequeath to my third and fourth son Thomas Brodren and Henry
 Brodren a tract of Land called the milke and containing three hundred acres to be equally
 divided between them my said sons and to the Heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten for ever
 and to be at age at the years of eighteen as aforesaid. As for my personal Estate my desire is
 that the same shall remain in my said Wife's hands and to be disposed of at her own will & pleasure
 and God constitute & Ordain my said loving Wife Sarah Brodren my sole and only Executor
 of this my last will and Testament. And do request my wellbeloved friend Francis Journe's Gent
 to observe and look over my papers books and to be an assistant to my said Wife after my decease.
