did before us grant unto you the said William Curbill full power & authority to do in all singular
his goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, and to demand collect and levy all and all manner of
debts and debts due and owing to the said deceased & well and faithfully to dispose of the same. And
out of the goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have may or shall come to your hands
possession, well and truly to pay the debts due by the said deceased, which debts may or shall so far forth
as the same will extend and the Law will charge you according to the true value of the sum thereof
in having first taken your Oath well and truly to do the same, and to make or cause to be made a true
perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which
have may or shall come to your hands possession or knowledge (appraised in money) and attend and just
receipt of and upon your Oath to exhibit the same into our County Court where will be or should
