 four pounds four shillings & six pence, which is the Right of the said aforesaid Pennant Charles for want of payment
 of the said sum of Twenty four pounds sterling money of England with damages & profits to the value of fifty five pounds with
 shillings of the said money & thereupon they being thus duly sworn.

 said, but the Court's opinion was that the said Bill could not be required there in. Likewise the said Attorney Remond & John Malat having no warrant
 to prosecute the action the Court dismissed the same.

 by these presents freely & voluntarily & absolutely give and grant all and singular that parcel and tract of Land known
 and called by the Name of Westly containing & laid out for two hundred & fifty acres being the Plantation that is now
 lye upon also much of Land known & called by the Name of Camis with all and singular the Rights & profits privi-
 ledges & Rights lye thereunto belonging, with houses Orchards or gardens & improvements whereof the said Ursula Worthington
 do the heirs of her said Ursula Worthington for ever to have and to hold the said two tracts of Land called
 as aforesaid freely & absolutely from me the aforesaid Andrew Worthington my heirs & assigns forever without
 any Claim title or interest that I the said Andrew or my aforesaid Son or may have hereafter to the said two tracts of Land
 given & granted to her the said Ursula aforesaid & to the heirs of her the said Ursula forever of the said two tracts of Land by liberty of our Courts or
 Courts in behalf of the whole as by the said Deed of Gift is intended meaning in which words of the said Deed is
 my hand & sign my seal this single day of November 1694. And in the Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles
 William & Mary King & Queen over England &c.
