## **VETOES**

## BILLS PASSED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF 1933 AND VETOED BY GOVERNOR RITCHIE AND HIS REASONS IN EACH CASE FOR THE SAME.

## THE TOTAL NUMBER OF BILLS VETOED IS 42.

(All of these bills were vetoed by the Governor after the adjournment of the Legislature, either having been presented to him after the adjournment of the Legislature or not in sufficient time to require executive action before adjournment.)

## ALLEGANY COUNTY SALARIES.

The Legislature passed a number of bills introduced by the Allegany County Delegation for the reduction of salaries of various county officials. These are House Bills 268. 270, 271, 272, 298, 356, 358, 420, 421, 422, 491 and 537, and they apply to the County Commissioners, the County Treasurer, the County Investigator, the Sheriff, the Deputy Sheriffs, the Court Stenographer, the Judges, Clerks and Bailiff of the People's Court, the Justices of the Peace in Frostburg, Midland, Lonaconing, Barton, Westernport and Mt. Savage, the Coroner, the Judge of the Juvenile Court, the State's Attorney and the Judges of the Orphans' Court.

There are also a number of county officials whose salaries are fixed by the Legislature, but who are not covered by any salary reduction bills. These are the County Clerk, the Supervisor of Assessments and the Election Supervisors.

In addition, there are still other officials whose salaries are not fixed by the Legislature, but who come under the jurisdiction of the County Commissioners. These include the County Health Officer, Inspector and Nurses, the County Auditor, the Superintendent and Matrons at the Allegany County Home, the attorneys of certain boards and a few others.
