we have already had an opportunity to consider, since she was kind enough to advance it to us. Is there anything you would like to add?

was in the State Department of Education, this provision about inviolate funds was particularly helpful in connection with their use for the prevention of money being diverted for the use of parochial schools, especially during the time I was there. I think it is very important to keep the funds for public purposes and, if we are going into the other, we ought to have special provisions in the Constitution for it. If we are going to support non-public schools, I think you should have a provision in the Constitution about it.

The other point I wanted to make is that our school law and the budget law of 1916, which the President of Hopkins University had a great deal of influence in writing, have worked so well for the last fifty years, that I think we ought to be very hesitant about changing these provisions that have helped to give us continuity in our policy. When I was in the department,
