If it will get a better education for the children in the State of Maryland, I am all for rocking the boat good and hard, but I do see that we could rock the boat to a point where we are doing a disservice, and I hope that you will take into consideration all the things that have been said and retain the very best. Thank you.

THE CHAIRLADY: Thank you very much, Mrs.

Robie. Well, I have twenty minutes after 1:00. I think
we can spare maybe two minutes, if any member of the
Commission has any urgent question to ask, particularly
of the speakers we have heard, to run through some
quickly.

MR. ENEY: Can I ask Major Lamborn to comment on one thing very briefly? Do you think it would be desirable to have in the Constitution a general provision somewhat along the lines of the phraseology of Article 43, but more specifically directed toward private schools and the desire of the State to further education in private schools as well as public schools?

MR. LAMBORN: Mr. Eney, I am not as familiar
