

1 DR. BURDETTE: Which is very much more than  
2 the present guidelines we have from the Supreme Court.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: More restrictive, you mean.

4 DR. BURDETTE: Yes. We don't have any real  
5 guidelines but there have been a great deal of call of  
6 15 per cent.

7 DR. WINSLOW: That is a 15 per cent spread?

8 DR. BURDETTE: I realize it is not a clear  
9 ruling.

10 MR. MINDEL: As a member of the Committee,  
11 what concerned us was the fact that if this restriction is  
12 not placed in the Constitution that the House of Delegates  
13 in future years could expand to a very large number. We  
14 took the number, for example, of 200. That comment did  
15 not appear in the Fourth Report, and we discussed it at  
16 our recent meeting, we thought it would get out of hand  
17 and one of the purposes was to keep the House of Delegates  
18 and the Senate down to a reasonable number, and we ought  
19 to take that into consideration.
