3 procedures. It modifies, officers. My point I want
4 to make is, if we are allowing a legislative body to
5 determine its own rules of procedure, we should not then
6 tell them what the procedure should be for investigating
7 purposes, namely what we say after that. If the Congress
8 of the United States determines its investigating powers
9 which is what we are stating here, so if we are going to
10 say, its rules of procedures, I don't think we should
11 tell them what to do.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: I am not sure I follow you.
13 You mean you think the phrase --

14 MRS. FREEDLANDER: The power to summon witnesses
15 or investigate for legislative purposes, is part of the
16 rules of procedures of committees.
