

1 Bill and how they tried to get certain information they
2 were unable to obtain. There is some doubt in my mind
3 that the members of the Legislature do have the subpoena
4 power. Certainly, I am agreeable to putting the safe-
5 guard in that Judge Adkins referred to that any subpoena
6 should be in the legislative process to investigate legis-
7 lative problems.

8 MR. CASE: Just in answer to that, Mr. Bond,
9 the Code is replete with section after section where
10 agencies have been created and legislatures granted them
11 complete subpoena power, and so if some other State
12 agency -- it is rather incongruous, it seems to me that
13 they couldn't give it to themselves.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: As I understand it, the Chairman
15 wants to take the Section back for future consideration
16 in light of these comments. Section 14.

17 DR. BARD: A majority of all the members of
18 each House shall constitute a quorum for the transaction
19 of business; but a smaller number may adjourn from day to
20 day and compel the attendance of absent members, et cetera.
21 This is pretty much like the language of Section 20.
