

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Any questions? Any comment?
2 Section 15.

3 DR. BARD: Each house shall keep a journal of
4 its proceedings and cause the same to be published. No
5 bill shall become a law unless it be passed in each House
6 by a majority of the members present, and on its final
7 passage the Yea and Nay votes be recorded in the journal
8 of the House finally passing such bill; nor shall any
9 resolution requiring the action of both Houses be passed
10 except in the same manner.

11 Now, the point here is, majority of those
12 present.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: We have made another change
14 also, I think, in that the questions and answers are
15 now recorded in the journal of each House, and you are
16 providing it be recorded in the House finally passing
17 the bill.
