

1 THE CHAIRMAN: I think the importance here
2 is that it will be a public record to which anyone can
3 go to get the results of the election. This becomes
4 very important. What exactly would the change be,
5 Yea and Nay votes be recorded in the journal?

6 DR. BARD: Of each House.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Upon final passage.

8 JUDGE ADKINS: I have another point. I think
9 it is a mistake to permit passage of a bill by 25 per
10 cent of the members of a legislature which is the effec-
11 tive rule of this provision, 25 plus one. I don't think
12 that is good representative government or anything else.

13 DR. BARD: This procedure is used in Congress
14 effectively. Used in the number of State legislatures,
15 and Congressman Miller, you want to speak to this point?

16 MR. MILLER: I think there is no danger what-
17 soever because if a delegate or senator may have very
18 good reasons for not having to go on the floor if it is
19 something that isn't important, but if he is not going
20 to be there on the final passage of the important bill,
21 but you said, Will the Legislature with the need of
