

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Delete the word, elected, in
2 the third line.

3 DR. BARD: Right.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: And the last line also. Any
5 further questions? Section 17.

6 DR. BARD: Any bill may originate in either
7 House of the General Assembly and be altered, amended,
8 passed or rejected by the other. No final vote for pas-
9 sage of a bill shall be taken until a bill shall have been
10 printed and until the third calendar day after introduc-
11 tion.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment?

13 MRS. FREEDLANDER: Again, I raise the question:
14 I can understand the second sentence and the reason for it,
15 but I wonder why the first sentence would not be an
16 internal problem, why is it necessary to have this a
17 constitutional provision?

18 MR. SCANLAN: The Senate could, say that any
19 bill could be voted up or down but no amendment.

20 DR. BURDETTE: Maybe someplace later, not
21 having read this earlier.
