

1 or require reprinting of a bill once it is introduced.
2 I don't think the Committee had that in mind.

3 MR. MILLER: If the bill is printed, it has
4 to be in the form it is finally passed.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Not necessarily except as re-
6 quired by House rules.

7 MR. MILLER: Then it doesn't make a whole lot
8 of difference because a member, and it has been used
9 many times in the Federal Congress, by demanding the
10 bill be printed before final passage, that is a terrible
11 printing problem if it is a large bill.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

13 MR. SAYRE: The wording here that I thought
14 might dissipate some of this problem, No bill shall
15 become a law unless it has been printed and lying upon
16 the desk of the members for five calendar days prior
17 to passage, except this provision may be suspended by
18 unanimous consent.

19 MR. MILLER: Your unanimous consent will be
20 awful hard to get.

21 DR. BARD: The model says three days.
