from my experience from working around Annapolis that the absolute figure would be most advantageous in the operation of the Legislature. In that way, the Legislatures know how many people have to be present in order to either pass or not pass a piece of legislation, especially if it is going to be a veto on a constitutional question.

There are, sometimes in the evening sessions, where they have night sessions, as many as 30 to 35 Members absent in the House alone. In the day sessions, lot of times there are sometimes as high as 15 or 20 absent on many occasions. Some of them are running around doing committee work, and some of them are not just there. It seems to me if you are going to use the higher figure, it is going tomake it that much more difficult for some of the people in the Legislature to be able to express their views and do the things they feel their constituents feel is necessary to do, but it seems to me that where the two-thirds might seem appropriate, three-fifths is more actually a practical matter to use in the formation of legislative policy and procedure.
