

1 It would have to be. It is a good question.

2 DR. JENKINS: Then there would be no change
3 in salaries for four years?

4 DR. BARD: Not until, if I follow the chronology
5 on this, there would not be any change in salary until
6 1974. Wouldn't that be right, John?

7 MR. BROOKS: Yes.

8 DR. JENKINS: I sincerely favor the Consti-
9 tutional Convention setting a salary for this initial
10 General Assembly.

11 DR. BARD: This was an alternate which we had.
12 Then we had the feeling that the advantages that might
13 come in raising the salary for that one period would be
14 more than outweighed by the disadvantages of placing
15 in the hands of the Convention this matter of setting a
16 salary for members of the State Legislature.

17 DR. JENKINS: I think it delays it too long
18 because this means another four years.

19 DR. BARD: Actually they could set it for the
20 Legislature of 1970. That is correct. It would only be
21 one Legislature for which they would be setting it.
