2 the wrath of the voters, where if he voted for himself and  
3 he was going to get it, then I think he would be much less  
4 likely to vote in favor of it.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: We have the same situation, it  
6 seems to me, with the Congress, and I think experience  
7 has indicated they are most reluctant to vote increases  
8 to themselves, unless they can tie it in with something  
9 else. Mr. Sayre?

10 MR. SAYRE: I think you stated that very well,  
11 in my opinion, relating it directly to Congress. I would  
12 like to see additional provision here which would work  
13 out to take a little bit of the onus of the increase  
14 being effective in 1970 and that is if we had a mandatory  
15 review at least every ten years by the General Assembly of  
16 all salaries of State, that is of the members of the  
17 General Assembly and statewide-elected officials, which  
18 would be the governor and lieutenant-governor.
