

the said subscription in the said book shall amount to the number to be determined upon by the master and wardens of said lodge, the same shall be closed; *Provided always*, that in case of the death, resignation, or refusal of any of the commissioners to act, the master and wardens of said lodge be and they are hereby empowered to supply such vacancy or vacancies, until the subscription book shall be closed; *Provided further*, that every person offering to subscribe in the said book in his own name, or in the name of any other person, shall upon subscribing, pay to the attending commissioners one dollar for every share to be subscribed, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of said commissioners in taking such subscriptions.

CHAP. 143.

3. *And be it enacted*, That the sums so subscribed shall be paid to the master and wardens of said lodge, in the manner following, to wit: One fourth part thereof at the end of two weeks after the subscription book shall be closed, and the remainder in such sums, and at such times and places, as the master and wardens of said lodge shall appoint, they giving at least ten days notice of the payments so required in the newspaper aforesaid.

Payments, how to be made

4. *And be it enacted*, That the master and wardens, for the time being, of Clinton Lodge number eighty-three, of free and accepted masons, and their successors, be and they are hereby declared a body corporate, so far as to enable them to hold an estate in fee simple in the lot of ground, which shall be chosen by the commissioners of Chester-Town as the site for said masonic hall, and in the building which shall be thereupon erected.

CHAP. CXLIV.

An Act to revive and extend the provisions of an act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of Commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Salisbury, in Somerset and Worcester Counties. Passed Mar 2 1827

1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Salisbury, in Somerset and Worcester counties, passed at November session eighteen hundred and twelve, be and the same is hereby revived and declared to be in full force, except such parts as are inconsistent with this act.

Act revived

2. *And be it enacted*, That the election of commissioners for the said town shall be on some day before the last day of May next, after five days public notice thereof, and of the place of holding said election, shall have been given, by advertisements set up at the taverns in said town, signed by some justice of the peace of either of the said counties, and the annual election thereafter shall be on some day to be appointed by the commissioners, of which ten days notice shall be given.

Election of commissioners

3. *And be it enacted*, That the commissioners shall meet as soon after their election as convenient, and may appoint a bailiff for the said town, and a clerk to record their proceedings, whom they shall have power to remove from time to time as they may see proper.

4. *And be it enacted*, That the limits of said town shall be as follows: Beginning at the mills called Polk's, now Bayly's
