RESOLUTIONS

Passed by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland at December Session, 1826.

No. 1.

THE General Assembly of Maryland, feeling the most un-Passed Dec 27 1820 dissembled sorrow for the irreparable loss of the illustrious Jef-ferson and Adams ferson and Adams, do RESOLVE unanimously, That the chair of the president of the senate, that of the speaker of the house of delegates, and the chair of the governor in the council chamber, be covered in black during the remainder of the present session of the general assembly.

No. 2.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and Passed Dec 29 1826 For the payment he is hereby authorised, to pay unto the several members of the of members of the late electoral college of the senate of Maryland, and the offi sec. cers thereof, and also to the several members of the present general assembly, and the officers thereof, and to their respective orders, the several sums of money now due, and that may from time to time become due to them respectively, and for which they shall obtain certificates from the chairman of the committee on claims of the present house of delegates.

No. 3.

RESOLVED, That a joint letter be addressed by the president Passed Jan 11 1827 of the senate, and speaker of the house of delegates, to the samuel Smith honourable Samuel Smith, informing him of his re-election to the senate of the United States.

No. 4.

RESOLVED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Passed Jan 16 1827 treasurer of the western shore pay to Benjamin Tomlinson, of jamin Tomlinson Allegany county, or to his order, the sum of thirty-two dollars.

No. 5.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Passed Jan 23 1927 Morton Tagart, or to his order, the sum of two hundred dol-ton Tagart lars, as a further remuneration for apprehending a certain Henry Snively, by virtue of the proclamation of the governor, on the 28th day of October 1825.

No. 6.

The committee on ways and means to whom was referred so Fassed Jan 25 1827 much of the executive communication as relates to the states, U.S. claims on the government of the United States, for expenditures in the last war with Great Britain, have had the several matters of this reference under consideration, and beg leave to present the following report-
