An Act to divorce Henrietta Hewitt, and her husband William Hewitt, of the City of Baltimore.

Passed Feb 14, 1827

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorce granted That the said Henrietta Hewitt be and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual cohabitation, with her husband William Hewitt.

2. And be it enacted, That the said William Hewitt shall Property hereafter not, by virtue of his marriage with the said Henrietta Hewitt, independently of be authorised to have or claim any right or intérest in the es- cacho her tate real, personal or mixed, of the said Henrietta Hewitt, to be by her acquired after the passage of this act; nor shall Henrictta Hewitt be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate real, personal or mixed, of the said William Hewitt, to be by him acquired after the passage of this act.

3. And be it enacted, That the said Henrietta Hewitt shall II Hewitt to have have and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities, and fine sole be subject to all the legal responsibilities, of a feme sole, in the same manner she would have been if she had never been mar-

ried.

4. And be it enacted, That the aforesaid Henrietta Hewitt To have the giarbe, and she is hereby declared to be, entitled to the custody and chadren guardianship of her children by her present marriage, during their minority.

5. And be it enacted, That the said William Hewitt shall Wm Hewitt not her her not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said debts

CHAP. LXXXVII.

An Act for the opening of Ensor Street in the City of Baltimore.

Passed Feb 13, 1827

- 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Commissioners ap-That James Mosher, George Deeker, Henry Stouffer, Robert street Carey Long, and John Ogston, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby appointed a board of commissioners, to open Ensor street in the city of Baltimore, from the north side of Forest-street, northwardly, to the south side of Monumentstreet, of the width of fifty-three fect, measuring from a line which would be found to be the west side of said street continued, as located to the southward of Forest-street aforesaid; and whenever a vacancy in said board may occur, by the refusal to act, resignation, death, or other inability of any of the said commissioners, the remainder of said commissioners, or so many of them as may consent to act, shall supply such vacancy by a new appointment or appointments, and a majority of said commissioners shall be competent to perform the duties of said board.

And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, after To ascertain dahaving given ten days notice in two of the newspapers printed in the city of Baltimore, shall proceed to ascertain and determine what damages will be sustained by the owners of property lying within or adjacent to the said street, by reason of the opening thereof, taking into consideration all advantages and disadvantages.
